### **Course Description and Student Learning Outcome:**

A second quarter introduction to elementary Mandarin. Emphasis is placed on listening, reading, writing, Mandarin Characters and translation as well as introduction of Chinese culture. In the end of this quarter, students are expected to be able to:

- Demonstrate a greater working command of essential vocabulary (recognize and reproduce a total of 300 Chinese characters) and language structures necessary to request and provide, orally and in writing, an increasing range of basic/simple information relating to high-frequency situations in familiar contexts such as making appointments, studying Chinese, school life, shopping and transportation.
- Derive meaning from short, simple texts on familiar topics, relying on contextual clues to extract the gist and an increasing amount of detail.
- Compose comprehensible, simple sentences about familiar topics to reflect a greater working command of core vocabulary and language structures.
- Demonstrate a deeper grasp of social protocols and contributions of Mandarin-speaking cultures, by analyzing and comparing them to one's own culture(s).

### **Dishonesty:**
